Race Disparities Among women with breast cancer

Black women in the U.S. are 40% more likely to die from breast cancer than white women. American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network

Black women are

During Donaldson's treatment, she learned that having money could make the difference between living and dying when it came to treating breast cancer. Donaldson founded the tgin Foundation due to the lack of support and social services for women undergoing treatment. Today she uses her space in the beauty industry to support uninsured women undergoing treatment for breast cancer, education towards the impact of health disparities on survivorship, and the importance of early detection for women under the age of 40.

At least 42% of newly diagnosed cancers are potentially avoidable, including the 19% caused by smoking and the 18% that are caused by a combination of excess body weight, physical inactivity, excess alcohol consumption, and poor nutrition. Cancer.org
